It is your choice whether to make a statement or to answer questions 11 12 during this session. Do you understand my explanation? GTMO Translator: [Translation of above]. Yes, Sir. 13 14 Guleed, are you planning on reading an opening 15 statement? 16 GTMO Translator: [Translation of above] 17 Detainee: Yes, Sir. 18 GTMO Translator: Yes, Sir. 19 Guleed, you may now make this statement to the Board. 20 GTMO Translator: [Translation of above] Detainee: Good morning everyone. I'm Guleed Hassan Duran. I 21 22 appreciate the opportunity to appear before you today. I 23 take this process seriously and I believe that it's 24 important for me to be here today and parti--participate in

the process. On the advice of my counsel and in consideration of the fact that my habeas case is being actively litigated in federal court in Washington, I must resp--respectfully decline to answer any questions during this hearing. There are however, a few thoughts that I would like to share with you. Please understand that I have been detained since 2004 under ver—under very difficult circumstances including some serious medical problems. I'm 47 years old and I've been held for nearly 20 years without charge or trial. I'm not, and even never have been, designated for prosecution.

I ask you each to put yourselves in my place. When you are in my position and have had almost no contact with outside world for a very long time, it can be very difficult to fully, to full eh, to fully imagine how to move forward and improve your situation by yourself. At some point, you have to put your faith and trust in others. I choose to trust my lawyers, and it's based on their advice that I will not answer any questions while we are waiting for Judge Walton to issue rulings in my habeas case. I admit that I'm also cautious and skep—skep—skeptical about this process today given what my experiences has been. Wouldn't you feel the same way if you were in my place? But I choose to trust you

and that you also take this process serious—seriously and
that you will see that I should not continue to be here.
As you consider your decision and the nearly 20 years old
information, you have a (unintelligible) about me. Please
do not mistake my decision not to answer questions as a
sign of defiance or bad attitude toward toward the United
States. It's not. Please understand too, I'm not happy
about what has happened to me or about being in Guantanamo.
It's very frustra-frustrating and demoralizing being held
for so long when you have no idea when you will be
released. And sometimes it boils over. Wouldn't you feel
the same way if you were held without charge for this long
or without any indication that you will be free one day
based on allegations from almost two dec-decades ago?
The last year I have a the last year and a half have been
particularly difficult because I have, I have had limited
contact with my family and continue to be very worried
about them given the pandemic and I'm sure you can
understand this. And I haven't been able to meet with my
lawyers in person because of the pandemic. It has been very
hard on me, but the fact of the matter is that I do
not have any ill will towards the United States. I never
have but I'm here and you are here. We are where we are

73		right now. We can not go back and change the past, but I'm
74		not the same person I was when I was arrested in 2004. That
75		was long long time ago, 17 years ago. It was a different
76		lifetime for me. All I want is just to move on my, on with
77		my fam-my life. I want to be re-re-reunited with my wife
78		and my children. I have lost so much time with them and it
79		has been very difficult for everyone. You have any idea
80		what it lies, what it's like to lose a barren or young
81		child as I have while you were, while you are in prison
82		with no idea when you will be released? You have no control
83		over what matters most to most to you in life. You feel
84		helpless. I don't want to lo- to lo- lose the next 20 years
85		or however much time I have left in my life to Guantanamo.
86		I don't want to die here, Inshallah. All I can add is that
87		I'm willing to be transferred anywhere, under any
88		circumstances, where I can live a quiet life and eventually
89		be united with my family. I want to get a job and support
90		them the way I have not been able to for for long time. I
91		hope your decision will allowed me to have a future beyond
92		Guantanamo. I consent to this statement being made public.
93		Thank you.
