- 19 PM: Yes.
- 20 Detainee: [Arabic]
- 21 Detainee: Uh, ladies and gentlemen, thank you for giving me an
- opportunity to have the Board. Allah create life and death
- to examine people who do good and bad. He also created the
- weak and the powerful so he could examine what they do.

25	Then they return to Allah and he will ensure justice is
26	done. I am Rahim Afghani, fifty-five age, from Chaprahar
27	district, Nangarhar province, Eastern Afghanistan. On 25
28	June 2007, in Lahore, Pakistan, I was captured while
29	I was traveling with my wife- wives and children. After
30	was transferred to, I was transferred
31	to C-, uh, to CIA custody. I was detained in Black site for
32	appro-, approximately one year and I faced inhuman
33	treatment, including torture. When I was transferred to CIA
34	custody, I expected more human treatment because the USA is
35	a democracy that respect human right. Instead, I was
36	tortured. In March of 2008, I was transferred to
37	Guantanamo, and I have been here ever since. It is well
38	known to you, the people of Afghanistan are very poor and,
19	uh, oppressed people. More than forty years of fighting and
10	destruction, Afghan- uh, Afghanistan has is the reason for
1	the poverty among Afghan and I am one of this tribe. Like
2	other Afghan, we have a family system and I, uh, was trying
3	to feed my family because I was the head of the family.
4	When I was working with Arabs, I was doing so due to
5	poverty. It was my job to provide for my family. I was
6	working with Arabs as an interpreter, driver, and I was
7	also helping them with agriculture and grocery shopping. I
8	was paid monthly to assist my family. As you know Puggia

invaded Afghanistan in 1979. After the invasion, America
and other nations came to assist the mujahideen against
Russia. Arab mujahideen also came to Afghanistan fight the
Russians. The people of Afghanistan do not forget the good
deeds of those helping against Russia. Our people are
always thanking those who help in hard time. The people of
the U-, US help Afghan mujahideen with weapons and money
and help Afghan refugees buy food, shelter, and medication
Afghans will never forget this because it is part of Afgha
history. When 9/11 happened, everything changed. Al-Qa'ida
used Afghan land against the United States, without the
knowledge or consi-, or consent of the Afghan people. But
Afghan were angry about this and did not agree. At that
time, the US planned to attack Afghanistan for revenge.
Amir [Unintelligible] Mullah Omar asked the US to not
attack Afghanistan, and we will try to find a good solution
for this issue. But US attacked anyway and, uh, destructive
fighting continued for twenty years with the, uh, exception
of three days cease fire. After twenty years, the US has
left Afghanistan and thank of God here is no-, now, uh,
peace and security there. I am one of the Afghan affected
and oppressed here in Guantanamo for 15 years without any
charge or justice. As the only Afghan high value detainee,
I also face discrimination here in Guantanamo. Every

channel is in Arabic. This is simple thing I, just I told
you, it's not some big thing, but this is very small thing.
There is, I don't have, we don't have any single Pashtu

times. All praise to Allah that the fighting in Afghanistan
is finished, and there is peace and security in all of
Afghanistan and all Afghans are happy about this. The
current situation is to the benefit of Afghan and America
because no fighting, uh, no Afghani mother is crying
because here is son who was murdered in the fighting. There
is no fighting alhamdulillah. Now after the withdraw, no
American mothers will be crying either. The US will no
longer spend millions of dollar a day fighting in

Afghanistan to anybody and Afghan land will not be used
against any country. Also, after a little time, all those

to attack other are fake news. The people of Afghanistan
want peace, security, and reconstruction. Everybody is

234	lawyer, he [unintelligible] me, he say, you cannot answer
235	anything about this, if you want to talk about, uh, general
236	and Afghanistan situation, I am ready to explain to you
237	what I know about. I don't have the bright picture of
238	Afghanistan completely because I don't have any, uh, uh,
239	more news of Afghanistan because I don't have any Pashtu
