The following personnel are also present: Legal Advisor to the Board, Case Administrator, Personal 14 15 Representative, Translators, the detainee and the Security 16 Officer. HO Translator: [Translates above] 17 The detainee's Personal Representative, the detainee, and 18 translator are located at the detention facility, U.S. 19 Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. They are attending via 20 video teleconference. The detainee has waived translation 21 of the unclassified summary and the Personal 22 Representative's statement. The unclassified summary has 23 been posted to the Periodic Review Secretariat website. 24 25 Foreign, national and local media, Foreign Government Officials, and Representatives from Non-Governmental 26 Organizations may be observing this session. 27 HO Translator: [Translates above] 28 PM: This Board is convened to determine whether continued law 29 of war detention is warranted for Abdullah Al Sharbi (ISN 30 682) to protect against a continuing significant threat to 31

This session of the 33 hearing is unclassified. 34 HQ Translator: [Translates above] 35 PM: Ghassan, this is your Periodic Review Board to determine 36 whether continued law of war detention is warranted in your 37 case. Continued law of war detention will be warranted if 38 it is necessary to protect against a continuing significant 39 threat to the security of the United States. The focus of 40 this hearing is on the threat you may pose to the United 41 States and its interests if transferred or released from 42 U.S. custody. It is not on the lawfulness of your 43 detention. 44 HO Translator: [Translates above] 45 The Personal Representative is your representative to 46 assist you during this process. Finally, the translators 47 ensure that everyone understands your statements and you 48 you understand what is being said during the hearing. 49 HQ Translator: [Translates above] 50 Personal Representative, has the detainee had an 51 opportunity to review the Unclassified Summary? 52 HQ Translator: [Translates above] 53 PR: Yes, Sir. 54 GTMO Translator: [Translates above] 55 Thank you. I will now read the Unclassified Summary: 56 Ghassan Abdullah Al Sharbi (ISN-682) attended U.S. aviation 57 training from 1998 to 2001, where he associated with two 58 9/11 hijackers. He later helped construct IEDs in Pakistan 59 to attack coalition forces and may have been involved in 60 Homeland attack planning, possibly including the plot by Jose Padilla to explode a radiological bomb. Al Sharbi was 62 captured in 2002 at a safe house of senior al-Qa'ida 63 facilitator Abu Zubaydah (ISN 10016) in Punjab Province, 64

65 Pakistan. Does the Personal Representative wish to make 66 unclassified Opening Statement at this time? HQ Translator: [Translates above] 67 PR: Yes, Sir. 68 69 GTMO Translator: [Translates above] 70 I would like to remind all participants that any information shared at this time must be unclassified. If 71 72 there is a concern about the classification of the 73 information, I will indicate as such and will stop the 74 proceedings until we resolve the issue. Has the detainee had an opportunity to review your statement? 75 HO Translator: [Translates above] 76 PR: Yes, Sir. 77 GTMO Translator: [Translates above] 78 79 Okay. Personal Representative, please proceed. HQ Translator: [Translates above] 80 Good morning ladies and gentlemen of the Board. I am the 81 Personal Representative for Mr. Abdullah Al Sharbi. 82 Ghassan, as he prefers to be called, is currently seeking a 83 Private Counsel but he was adamant about being present for 84 this important opportunity with or without the 85 86 participation of counsel. 87 Ghassan has been in detainment since March of 2002. During 88 89 that time his health deteriorated, making it difficult for him to move and painful to travel for meetings and phone 90 calls. In the last year, Ghassan has started working with 91 the medical staff at the Camp in an effort to improve his 92 mobility and overall health. He worked through the pain to 93 attend our first meeting, but the physical discomfort he 94 was in was evident. I have been impressed over the last few 95

months seeing the great effort he made to attend all the

97	meetings I scheduled to prepare for this board. I have also
98	been fortunate enough to witness his health start to
99	improve.

101	Ghassan knows that the board has questions about his
102	mindset and his hopes for the future and he is here today
103	to answer those questions. During our meetings, we have had
104	many discussions about what he thinks his life will look
105	like outside of Guantanamo. Ghassan holds a bachelor's
106	degree and is fluent in English. He has lived in the United
107	States and Europe and is familiar and comfortable around
108	those of different backgrounds and faiths. I believe he
109	could assimilate well in either an Arabic or English-
110	speaking country. He would like to find a job where he
111	could use his degree, but recognizes he may need some
112	additional training as the engineering world has continued
113	to evolve during his detention. Alternatively, he has
114	considered the possibility of becoming a teacher or tutor
115	as he has a minor in Mathematics from Embry-Riddle.
116	
117	I believe that with a little assistance navigating the job
118	market or enrolling in continued education, Ghassan has the
119	capacity to flourish wherever he is sent. Thank you for
120	your time today and we are standing by for your questions.

122	detainee and witness statements have been presented in
123	their entirety. However, does anyone have huh questions at
124	this particular time?
