## GUANTANAMO DETAINEE FILE REVIEW

Hani Saleh Rashid Abdullah (YM-841) traveled to fight in Afghanistan in June 2001, trained at al-Qa'ida's al-Farouq camp, and admitted having a close association with al-Qa'ida's external operations planners and leaders. He was one of six Yemeni fighters—the so-called Karachi Six—who Pakistani authorities arrested when they raided two safehouses in Karachi in 2002. Since our review in November 2016, Abdullah has remained highly compliant with the guard force and has continued to refrain from expressing support for extremist activity or anti-US sentiments, probably because he does not want to harm his prospects for release. Abdullah has not renounced support for violent extremism; however, we assess that he remains focused on his release and reconnecting with family. We remain concerned about possible links between some of Abdullah's family and people affiliated with AQAP or other extremists.
